

Transport Department Notice

Special Traffic and Transport Arrangements in Kwai Tsing District for Ching Ming Festival 2017

Notice is hereby given that the following traffic and transport arrangements will be implemented in the vicinity of the Tsuen Wan Chinese Permanent Cemetery and Crematorium from 7.00 a.m. to 5.00 p.m. daily on 26 March 2017 and 2, 4, 9, 15 and 16 April 2017 for the Ching Ming Festival 2017 :

- (a) Wing Tak Street (southbound) from entrance of City Point to its junction with Wing Sheung Street, Wing Yin Street and the section of Wing Shun Street between Wing Tak Street and Kwai Hei Street will be temporary closed to all vehicular traffic (except for hearses, franchised buses, green minibuses, taxi and emergency vehicles).
- (b) The section of Wing Kei Road between Kwai Hei Street and Wing Kin Road will be converted into one-way southbound. Vehicles will only be allowed to enter Wing Kei Road from Wing Kin Road.
- (c) Wing Chong Street, Wing Hau Street and Wing Lap Street will be closed to all vehicular traffic (except for emergency vehicles).
- (d) Temporary taxi stands will be provided at the following locations:
 - (i) Wing Kin Road near its junction with Wing Kei Road;
 - (ii) Kwai Hei Street near its junction with Wing Shun Street;
 - (iii) Wing Shun Street near its junction with Wing Yin Street; and
 - (iv) Wing Shun Street near its junction with Yi Lok Street.

The above arrangements will be implemented on any other dates if traffic situation so requires.

In addition, Wing Yin Street and Wing Hau Street will be also closed to all vehicular traffic (except for hearses, franchised buses and emergency vehicles) from 7.00 am to 5.00 pm on 19 and 25 March 2017 and 1, 8, 14 and 17 April 2017.

A special bus service, route no. 38S, will be operated on 2, 4 and 9 April 2017 between MTR Kwai Fong Station (Kwai Yan Road) and Tsuen Wan Chinese Permanent Cemetery at a headway of 3 to 8 minutes.

Appropriate traffic signs will be provided on-site to guide motorists. Depending on the crowd and traffic conditions in the area, the Police may vary the implementation details of the above traffic and transport arrangements.

During the festive period, grave-sweepers are advised to use public transport services to Tsuen Wan Chinese Permanent Cemetery and Crematorium. No parking will be permitted on any approach roads in the vicinity of the Cemetery and Crematorium. Any vehicle found parking on these roads will be towed away without prior notice.
