I. ROUTEING

Route A

REGAL HONG KONG HOTEL to AIRPORT (CIRCULAR): via Irving Street, Pennington Street, Yee Wo Street, Hennessy Road, Fleming Road, Convention Avenue, Hung Hing Road, Cross Harbour Tunnel, Hong Chong Road, Gascoigne Road, Ferry Street, West Kowloon Highway, Stonecutters Bridge, Nam Wan Tunnel, Cheung Tsing Highway, Lantau Link, North Lantau Highway, Airport Road, Hong Kong International Airport Terminal 2 Coach Station, Airport Road, North Lantau Highway, Lantau Link, Cheung Tsing Highway, Nam Wan Tunnel, Stonecutters Bridge, Tsing Sha Highway, West Kowloon Highway, Ferry Street, Gascoigne Road, Hong Chong Road, Cross Harbour Tunnel, Gloucester Road, Causeway Bay Flyover, Gloucester Road, Gloucester Road Flyover, Tung Lo Wan Drive, Moreton Terrace, Causeway Road and Irving Street.

II. STOPPING POINT

- Regal Hong Kong Hotel
- Airport Terminal 2 (Coach Station)

**** Prior approval has to be obtained from the management offices of Airport Authority Hong Kong and Regal Hong Kong Hotel for stopping at their private premises.**

IV. VEHICLE ALLOCATION

One single-deck public bus of carrying capacity not exceeding 28 passengers and be granted with valid hotel (A02) service endorsement.
