

Disabled Person's Parking Permit (DPPP)

Uses of DPPP	<p>Holder of a Disabled Person's Parking Permit :</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. is exempted from payment of parking charges for using an on-street metered parking space; 2. is permitted to park at a designated disabled parking space; and 3. is granted half-fare concession on parking charges for using a designated parking space in any of the Government multi-storey car parks under the management of Transport Department.
Eligibility	<p>Applicant is a disabled person holding a full driving licence, a learner's driving licence or a probationary driving licence which permits the applicant to drive the relevant vehicle of which the applicant or the applicant's spouse, where his / her spouse is also a disabled person, is the registered owner of the relevant vehicle.</p> <p>According to the Road Traffic Ordinance (Chapter 374), a disabled person means a person who is the holder of a certificate signed by or on behalf of the Director of Health or the Hospital Authority stating that such person is suffering from a permanent disease or physical disability that causes him considerable difficulty in walking. For the purpose of confirming whether the applicant is a "disabled person" as defined in Road Traffic Ordinance (Cap. 374), he/she is required to provide a <u>"Supplementary Health Information Sheet for Medical Assessment for Concessions"</u> and <u>"Supplementary Health Information Sheet for Driver Assessment"</u> ("Supplementary Health Information Sheet for Driver Assessment" not applicable to applicants having been issued with an approval letter by the Transport Department) completed by a doctor to facilitate the assessment conducted by the Community Rehabilitation Service Support Centre of the Hospital Authority.</p>
Application and Supporting Documents	<p>To complete the Application for Disabled Person's Parking Permit (TD464), and provide photocopies of the following supporting documents:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (i) the applicant's identity document; (ii) the Vehicle Modification Examination Certificate (if any); and (iii) other document(s) (if applicable).
