

TRANSPORT DEPARTMENT NOTICE

Special Traffic and Transport Arrangements in Pok Fu Lam, Aberdeen, Peak Area and Happy Valley for Chung Yeung Festival 2025

Notice is hereby given that, the following special traffic and transport arrangements will be implemented in Pok Fu Lam, Aberdeen, Peak Area and Happy Valley during the Chung Yeung Festival 2025 to facilitate grave-sweeping activities.

(A) Special Traffic and Transport Arrangements

(I) Pok Fu Lam

(i) Traffic diversion

The section of Consort Rise between Victoria Road and Bisney Road will be converted to one-way southbound by the Police from 7.00 am to 5.30 pm daily on 18, 19, 25, 26 and 29 October, 1, 2, 8 and 9 November; depending on the traffic conditions in the vicinity of the cemeteries.

(ii) Bus services

(a) Provision of special bus services

Special bus routes will be operated on the following dates and the bus services will be strengthened subject to passenger demand and traffic conditions:-

Special departures of Cross Harbour Route 971R (Mong Kok (Shanghai Street near Bute Street) to Cyberport)	26 and 29 October	9.00 am to 10.15 am

(b) Enhancement of bus services

Services of CTB routes 33X (Cyberport – Shau Kei Wan) and 43M (Tin Wan Estate – Shek Tong Tsui (Des Voeux Road West Near Hill Road)) will be strengthened subject to passenger demand and traffic conditions on 25, 26 and 29 October, 1 and 2 November.

(c) Bus stop arrangement

Additional bus stops at Pok Fu Lam Road outside and opposite to HKCCCU Pok Fu Lam Road Cemetery will be provided for CTB route 33X on 25, 26 and 29 October, 1 and 2 November.

(iii) Suspension of parking spaces

4 metered parking spaces (meter nos. 3941A, 3941B, 3942A and 3942B) and 3 motorcycle parking spaces at Victoria Road near Consort Rise will be temporarily suspended from 7.00 am on 25 October to 5.00 pm on 2 November.

(II) Aberdeen

(i) Road closures

Peel Rise in the vicinity of Aberdeen Chinese Cemetery and the slip road leading from Shek Pai Wan Road to Aberdeen Chinese Cemetery will be closed to all vehicular traffic by the Police depending on the traffic conditions in the vicinity of the cemetery during the following periods:

- (a) from 7.30 am to 5.30 pm daily on 18, 19, 25 and 26 October, 1, 2, 8 and 9 November; and
- (b) from 7.30 am to 6.30 pm on 29 October.

(ii) Bus services

(a) Provision of special bus services

CTB route 347 (Admiralty Station (West) Bus Terminus to Chinese Christian Cemetery / Aberdeen (Circular)) will be operated from 8.00 am to 4.30 pm daily on 26 and 29 October and the service may be strengthened subject to passenger demand and traffic conditions.

(b) Enhancement of bus services

Services of CTB route 43M will be strengthened subject to passenger demand and traffic conditions.

(III) Peak Area

(a) Road closures

Lugard Road, Harlech Road and Mount Austin Road will be temporarily closed to all vehicular traffic from 9.00 am to 11.59 pm on 29 October (except for access by local residents or vehicles with permits). Affected vehicles on Peak Road northbound heading for Lugard Road, Harlech Road and Mount Austin Road will be diverted to Peak Road southbound via the slip road next to the carpark entrance of the Peak Galleria.

(b) Suspension of Parking Spaces

The metered parking spaces, motorcycle parking spaces and disabled parking spaces at Mount Austin Road will be temporarily suspended from 12.01 am to 11.59 pm on 29 October.

(IV) Happy Valley

Relocation of tram stop

The tram stop on Wong Nai Chung Road northbound opposite to the Hong Kong Jockey Club will be relocated about 30 meters northward from 7.00 am to 7.00 pm on 29 October.

(B) Attention and Appeal

1. Appropriate traffic aids or signs will be erected to guide motorists.
2. The public transport operators will display notices to advise passengers of the above temporary arrangements.
3. Actual implementation and adjustments to road closures, traffic control and public transport diversions will be made by the Police during Chung Yeung Festival depending on road condition. Police officers will be on-site to guide the motorists.
4. Motorists are advised not to drive to the congested and affected areas. In case of traffic congestion, motorists should exercise tolerance and patience and observe the instruction given by the Police, and watch out for the latest traffic news through the media.
5. Motorists are advised that, any vehicles found illegally parked within the precinct of the special traffic arrangements may be towed away by the Police without prior notice.
6. Grave-sweepers are advised to plan their journey early and allow more travelling time, and use public transport services as far as possible.
