Special Traffic and Transport Arrangements for Concert Event at Kai Tak Sports Park

To facilitate the holding of a concert at the Kai Tak Sports Park (KTSP) on the evening from June 27 to 29, the following special traffic and transport arrangements will be implemented in the vicinity of Kowloon City:

(A) Traffic Control Measures

Police may implement temporary traffic diversions in the vicinity of KTSP depending on the actual traffic and crowd conditions, members of the public are advised to exercise tolerance and patience and take heed of the instructions given by the Police.

(B) Public Transport Arrangements

(i) Special bus route services

After the event on each day, a total of 11 special bus routes will be provided at the Sung Wong Toi Road Special Bus/Taxi Pick-up/Drop-off Area:

(Service will be provided from about 15 minutes after event finishes and the last departure will depart about 45 minutes after event finishes. Actual number of departures and hours of operation maybe adjusted to suit passenger demand)

Cross-boundary travellers can take Route No. SP12 to Lok Ma Chau (San Tin) Public Transport Interchange and transfer to the Lok Ma Chau-Huanggang cross-boundary shuttle bus (Yellow Bus) for their journey to the Mainland; or take Route No. A25S to HZMB Hong Kong Port

and transfer to HZMB shuttle bus (Gold Bus) for their return to Macao or Zhuhai, or departing from Hong Kong via the airport respectively.

(ii) Temporary Relocation of Bus Stops

To facilitate the implementation of temporary traffic arrangements by Police, the following bus stops will be temporarily relocated from 9.00 pm to 11.59 pm daily and details are as follows:

- (i) the bus stop at To Kwa Wan Road near Grand Waterfront Plaza will be temporarily relocated forward for about 30 metres; and
- (ii) the bus stop at Mok Cheong Street near the Hong Kong Society for the Blind will be temporarily relocated backward for about 50 metres.

(iii) Taxi Service

The Kai Tak Stadium Taxi PUDO (G/F outside Gate H) will be opened for taxi pick-up and drop-off. For Sung Wong Toi Road PUDO, it will remain open for taxi drop-off during admission period, and be suspended for taxi pick-up/drop-off during the dispersal period. The taxi pick-up/drop-off arrangements in the vicinity of the KTSP during the event are set out below:

(C) Attention and Appeal

As the traffic in the vicinity of the KTSP is expected to be heavy during the event period, concertgoers should opt for public transport, avoid driving or taking private cars (including cross-boundary private cars). Concertgoers from the Mainland are urged to plan their journeys early and use the MTR or cross-boundary coach services as far as possible.

Members of the public may use the "HK eMobility" mobile application for pre-trip planning and point to point public transport, driving and walking route enquiry.

On the event days, spectators are advised to take heed of the real-time information via on-site broadcast and the "Easy Leave" (easyleave.police.gov.hk) as well as the latest traffic news through the TD's website (www.td.gov.hk), the "HK eMobility" mobile application, radio and television broadcasts.
