Temporary Traffic Arrangements on Cheung Tsing Highway, North West Tsing Yi Interchange and Lantau Link

To facilitate road works, motorists are advised that the following temporary traffic arrangements will be implemented on Cheung Tsing Highway, North West Tsing Yi Interchange and Lantau Link during the time specified below:

A. Lane Closure

Date and Time	Location	Direction
From 0.00 mid-night on 23 April 2025 to 6.00 am on 26 April 2025	(i) Parts of the traffic lanes between Cheung Tsing Highway (near its junction with North West Tsing Yi Interchange) and Lantau Link (Tsing Ma Bridge near Ma Wan Road); and	Airport Bound
	(ii) Parts of the traffic lane on the slip road of North West Tsing Yi Interchange leading from Tsing Yi North Coastal Road to Lantau Link will be temporary closed.	
From 6.00 am on 26 April 2025 to 6.00 am on 18 May 2025	(i) Parts of the traffic lanes between Cheung Tsing Highway (near its junction with North West Tsing Yi Interchange) and Lantau Link (near Tsing Yi Tower of Tsing Ma Bridge); and	
	(ii) Parts of the traffic lane on the slip road of North West Tsing Yi Interchange leading from Tsing Yi North Coastal Road to Lantau Link will be temporary closed.	

B. Temporary Speed Limit

Date and Time	Location	Direction
From 0.00 midnight to 5.30 am on 23 April 2025	(i) The section of Lantau Link between Tsing Ma Bridge (Tsing Yi Tower) and Tsing Ma Bridge (near Ma Wan Road) will be temporarily subject to a speed limit of 50 kilometres per hour.	Airport Bound
From 0.00 midnight to 5.30 am daily on 29 April 2025 and 3, 7, 9, 13 and 15 May 2025	(i) The section of Lantau Link (near Tsing Yi Tower of Tsing Ma Bridge) will be temporarily subject to a speed limit of 50 kilometres per hour.	

Motorists are advised to use the carriageway of the lower deck of Tsing Ma Bridge to Airport when it is open (except those driving vehicles carrying dangerous goods belonging to Category 1, 2, 3 or 3A). Motorist are also advised to stay alert to the latest traffic news through the media or the TD's mobile application "HKeMobility" or website (www.td.gov.hk). Appropriate traffic signs will be erected on site to guide motorists.
