Special Traffic and Transport Arrangements for Music Ceremonies at Kai Tak Stadium

To facilitate the holding of music ceremonies at the Kai Tak Stadium of Kai Tak Sports Park (KTSP) on 22 and 23 August 2026, the following special traffic and transport arrangements will be implemented in the vicinity of Kowloon City:

(A) Traffic Control Measures

(i) Banning of Turning Movement

All vehicles are prohibited from making right turn from Muk Tai Street eastbound onto Shing Kai Road southbound; or going straight from Muk Tai Street eastbound onto Shing Fung Road eastbound from 3 p.m. to 5 p.m. and from 10 p.m. to 11:30 p.m. daily on 22 and 23 August 2026.

(ii) Traffic Diversion

- (a) Vehicles on Muk Tai Street eastbound heading for Shing Kai Road southbound will be diverted via Shing Kai Road northbound and U-turn at the roundabout near Eastern Road Substation, then heading for Shing Kai Road southbound; and
- (b) Vehicles on Muk Tai Street eastbound heading for Shing Fung Road eastbound will be diverted via Shing Kai Road northbound and U-turn at the roundabout near Eastern Road Substation, then via Shing Kai Road southbound for Shing Fung Road eastbound.

In addition, the Police may implement other temporary traffic diversions in the vicinity of KTSP at short notice depending on the actual traffic and crowd conditions, members of the public are advised to exercise tolerance and patience and take heed of the instructions given by the Police.

(B) Public Transport Arrangements

(i) Railway Services

The service headway of the MTR Tuen Ma Line will be enhanced during the dispersal period on the event days.

(ii) Special Bus Route Services

After the event on each day, a total of 11 special bus routes will be provided at the Sung Wong Toi Road PUDOA:

(Service will be provided from about 15 minutes after event finishes. Actual number of departures and hours of operation maybe adjusted to suit passenger demand)

Cross-boundary travellers can take Route No. SP12 to Lok Ma Chau (San Tin) Public Transport Interchange and transfer to the Lok Ma Chau-Huanggang cross-boundary shuttle bus (Yellow Bus) for their journey to the Mainland; or take Route No. A25S to HZMB Hong Kong Port and transfer to HZMB shuttle bus (Gold Bus) for their return to Macao or Zhuhai, or departing from Hong Kong via the airport respectively.

(iii) Temporary Suspension of Bus Stop

The bus stop at Shing Kai Road outside CLP Headquarters will be temporarily suspended daily from 2 p.m. to 11:59 p.m. on 22 and 23 August 2026.

Passenger notices will be displayed by bus companies at their website and mobile application to inform passengers of the service arrangements. For service details, please visit KMB's website (www.kmb.hk) or CTB's website (www.citybus.com.hk).

(iv) Taxi Service

The Kai Tak Stadium Taxi PUDOA (G/F outside Gate H) will be opened for taxi pick-up and drop-off. The taxi pick-up/drop-off arrangements in the vicinity of the KTSP during the event days are set out below:

(C) Suspension of Metered Parking Spaces

The 35 metered parking spaces on Sung Wong Toi Road (nos. 8713A to 8731B) will be temporarily suspended from 8 a.m. on 22 August 2026 to 11:59 p.m. on 23 August 2026.

(D) Attention and Appeal

As the traffic in the vicinity of the KTSP is expected to be heavy during the event period, spectators should opt for public transport, avoid driving or taking private cars (including cross-boundary private cars). Spectators from the Mainland are urged to plan their journeys early and use the MTR, special bus routes or cross-boundary coach services as far as possible.

Members of the public may use the “HKeMobility” mobile application for pre-trip planning and point to point public transport, driving and walking route enquiry.

On the event days, spectators are advised to take heed of the real-time information via on-site broadcast and the "Easy Leave" (easyleave.police.gov.hk) as well as the latest traffic news through the TD's website (www.td.gov.hk), the "HKeMobility" mobile application, radio and television broadcasts.
