

Notes for Applying for Closed Road Permit (for Hong Kong Cross-boundary Goods Vehicle to Macao via HZMB)

1. Submit application for Closed Road Permit

- 1.1 After the Hong Kong Goods Vehicle owners/applicants submitted their applications to the Transport Bureau of Macao through their online application system and are confirmed by their authorities that they have successfully registered, the Hong Kong Goods Vehicle owners/applicants need to apply for a Closed Road Permit from the Cross Boundary Unit of the Transport Department.
- 1.2 Applicants could submit their application for Closed Road Permit in person, by agent, by post or drop-in-box (Address: Room 1032, 10/F, Harbour Building, 38 Pier Road, Central, Hong Kong) to this Department.

- 1.4 The Cross Boundary Unit will issue Closed Road Permit to applicants after verifying the related application as well as all required documents.

2. Points to Note when applying for Closed Road Permit

- 2.1 When applying for and being issued with a Closed Road Permit, the vehicle must hold a valid Hong Kong vehicle licence.
- 2.2 You can pay by cash, cheque, EPS or FPS. If paid by cheque, please make the cheque payable to “**The Government of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region**” or “**The Government of the HKSAR**” and crossed.

2.3 Fee:

Flat rate fees for closed road permit valid for 12 to 60 months	\$588
Fee per month for closed road permit valid for less than 12 months ^{Note}	\$49

Note: Any part of a month counts as one month.

3. Points to Note when departing Hong Kong

3.1 Hong Kong Goods Vehicle must hold a valid Closed Road Permit and complete the booking for using Macao Cross-Border Cargo Transfer Terminal (“Terminal”) on “Hong Kong-Zhuhai-Macao Bridge Macao Cross-Border Cargo Transfer Terminal Booking System” of Macao SAR Government, before travelling to the Terminal via Hong Kong-Zhuhai-Macao Bridge on the booking date.
