Bus Route Planning Programme for Southern District 2022-2023

Purpose

This paper elaborates and seeks the views of Members on the Bus Route Planning Programme (BRPP) for Southern District 2022-2023.

BRPP planning considerations

- 2. Franchised buses are major road-based mass carriers with high passenger carrying capacity and provide services with certain flexibility. Having regard to local developments, demographic changes, completion of transport facilities, existing and planned public transport services in the districts concerned, etc., the Transport Department (TD) has been continuously enhancing the existing bus service network, and planning bus routes and adjusting bus services for developing and newly-developed districts as appropriate, so as to cater for passenger demand. Meanwhile, through rationalising the bus routes and deploying the resources thus saved to enhance those existing services with increased demand or introduce new bus services, TD aims to achieve better utilisation of resources and ensure that passenger demand are aptly addressed while bus services develop with sustainability.
- 3. With respect to bus services on Hong Kong Island, following the commissioning of the West Island Line and South Island Line (East) respectively in March 2015 and December 2016, changes in residents' travel demand and patterns have led to a substantial drop in franchised bus patronage. As of November 2021, the patronage figures of bus routes on Hong Kong Island operated by Citybus Limited (Franchise 1) and New World First Bus Services Limited had seen cumulative decreases of about 24% and 13% respectively since the commissioning of the West Island Line.
- 4. In this connection, TD will review and rationalise franchised bus services on Hong Kong Island in a holistic approach. With the reorganisation of bus routes in the district, route rationalisation will achieve the greatest complementary effects.

BRPP for 2022-2023

- 5. In response to changes in residents' travel demand and patterns, we have devised a draft BRPP for 2022-2023 having regard to the views of the local communities and following discussion with the franchised bus companies. The table attached provides proposals under the BRPP for Southern District and <u>Annexes 1 to 7</u> set out the details.
- 6. In formulating the BRPP, TD and the franchised bus companies have made reference to the following guidelines on bus service adjustment. In addition, TD will give appropriate regard to the overall public transport service network and allow

flexibility for more effective utilisation of bus resources, ensuring that the service adjustment of bus routes will achieve the greatest efficiency.

Serving needs

7. To tie in with demographic changes, TD will increase bus trip frequencies in accordance with the existing passenger demand for bus service or introduce new bus services as appropriate.

(1) Frequency Improvement

8. Where the occupancy rate of a bus route reaches 90% and 75% during the busiest half-hour of the peak period and during that one hour respectively, or reaches 60% during the busiest one hour of the off-peak period, TD and the franchised bus companies will consider increasing its trip frequency. Apart from making reference to occupancy rate indicators, we will give consideration to providing a pleasant travelling environment for passengers, especially for bus services operated on longer routes.

(2) Introduction of Services

9. We will consider the introduction of new bus services having regard to community developments of individual districts, particularly population growth in the New Territories. New bus routes and additional bus trips, particularly those plying between the New Territories and the urban areas, may inevitably lead to heavier traffic flow in busy road sections in the urban areas. In considering the introduction of new bus services, we will as far as possible avoid the busy road sections of busy spots in the urban areas and reduce the number of bus trips of other routes operating via these road sections. As mass carriers, buses are more effective in utilising busy road sections than other road-based transport vehicles such as private cars. Overall speaking, an increased number of passengers using bus services will be conducive to alleviating traffic congestion in busy road sections.

(3) Interchange Schemes

10. We have been working with the franchised bus companies to formulate bus-bus interchange schemes at appropriate and feasible locations to enable bus passengers to reach more destinations through interchanging with fare concessions. Such interchange schemes reduce the need for new long haul and direct point-to-point bus service, enable better utilisation of limited road space and bus resources, enhance the efficiency of the overall bus network, and lessen the traffic congestion and environmental problems caused by duplication of bus services.

Service Rationalisation

11. For bus routes with low utilisation, we will review them with the franchised bus companies from time to time and implement various measures to enhance their efficiency in light of their actual performance. These include adjustment to the headway and service hours of existing routes, or truncation, amalgamation and cancellation of routes, etc. as appropriate.

(1) Frequency Reduction

12. Where the average occupancy rate of a route falls below 75% during the busiest half-hour of the peak period, or below 30% during the off-peak period, TD and the franchised bus companies will give consideration to reducing service frequency. However, in cases where such a route serves the actual travel needs of the district with no alternatives available (including bus-bus interchange schemes), or the peak headway of the route is already set at 15 minutes or more and off-peak headway at 30 minutes or more, TD and the franchised bus companies will, according to individual circumstances, consider measures including firstly deploying single deck buses to replace double deck buses for better utilisation of bus resources and enhancement of the overall efficiency of the bus service network.

(2) Route Cancellation / Amalgamation

13. To ensure proper use of resources, where the utilisation of a low-frequency route is not high (i.e. with occupancy rate during the busiest one hour lower than 50% despite its headways being maintained at only 15 minutes and 30 minutes or above during peak hours and off-peak hours respectively), we will consider proposing to cancel the route or amalgamate it with other route(s) after evaluating the impact on passengers and taking into account the alternative services available, along with their service levels and fares.

(3) Route Truncation

14. To optimise the use of resources, TD will examine the patronage of individual routes with the franchised bus companies from time to time to see, for example, whether the majority of passengers have alighted en-route, and thus explore the feasibility of route truncation. As a reference benchmark, we will check whether the route's occupancy rate falls below the range of 20% to 30% at the proposed terminating points during the busiest one hour, for determining whether it should be truncated. Moreover, we will see if there are roadside spaces along the route to accommodate interchange facilities for passengers to connect to other bus routes to their destinations.

Advice Sought

15. Members are invited to give views on the BRPP for Southern District 2022-2023.

• To tie in with the proposed route extension of Route No. 30X, the following new en-route stops will be arranged to replace the existing bus stops.



The Proposal

- Currently, CTB Route No. 70P only provides single bound service from Shek Pai Wan to Central during morning peak hours from Mondays to Fridays and Saturdays with 5 and 3 departures respectively; while CTB Route No. 76 provides circular services from Shek Pai Wan to Causeway Bay from 6 a.m. to 7 p.m. daily.
- To cater for passenger demand in Shek Pai Wan, it is proposed to extend the service of Route No. 70P to a whole day service that operates until evening peak hours and provide return trip service from Central to Shek Pai Wan.
- To tie in with the service adjustment of Route No. 70P, the service frequency of Route No. 70 will be adjusted and combined departures plying between Aberdeen and Central will be jointly operated by Route Nos. 70 and 70P. In parallel, Route Nos. 70 (special departures from Aberdeen) and 70A will be amalgamated with Route No. 70P.
- There are numerous bus routes in the Southern District that provide more direct services to Causeway Bay with service frequency higher than Route No. 76. Passengers tend to use those bus routes to travel to Causeway Bay and the occupancy of Route No. 76 is consistently low with a daily average occupancy rate of about 38%. Hence, we propose to adjust the services of Route No. 76 as follows:
 - the terminating point will be relocated from Shek Pai Wan Estate Public Transport Interchange to Wong Chuk Hang Station and the routeing will be shortened to ply between Wong Chuk Hang Station and Causeway Bay with headway adjusted to every 60 minutes during the time between two peak periods; and
 - the morning special departure on school days will be altered to operate at 7.20 a.m. departing from Wong Chuk Hang and a new afternoon special departure will operate at 3.30 p.m on school days from Wong Chuk Hang Station to Causeway Bay (Pennington Street).
- With the provision of return trip service and extension of daily service hours to evening peak hours, passengers of Route No. 70P in Shek Pai Wan can take Route No. 70P and interchange with Route No. 76 to travel to and from Shouson Hill and Wong Nai Chung Gap.
- To tie in with the proposed service adjustment of Route No. 76, new Octopus / electronic payment bus-bus interchange concessions between CTB Route Nos. 70P, 72, 76 and NWFB Route No. 95 will be offered.







The Proposal

- Route No. 94 currently provides service between Lei Tung Estate and Central (Central Ferry Piers) in the morning peak hours from Mondays to Saturdays (except Public Holidays). For other time, residents may use Route No. 91 plying via Lei Tung Estate.
- The routeings of Route No. 91 and Route No. 94 largely overlap along the section between Aberdeen and Central, and their occupancy rates in the morning peak hours remain low. Their maximum occupancy rates in the peakiest hour in the morning are only 49% and 47% respectively.



The Proposal

- Before the commissioning of South Island Line, CTB Route No. 96 mainly provided railway feeder services for passengers travelling between Lei Tung / Wong Chuk Hang and Causeway Bay Station and provided services for passengers to travel to and from the Causeway Bay commercial area. Since the commissioning of South Island Line in December 2016, passengers can take railway services at Lei Tung Station and Wong Chuk Hang Station to Causeway Bay direct. The original role of Route No. 96 has changed.
- The journey time from Lei Tung Station to Causeway Bay Station is about 20 minutes while that of Route No. 96 is about 40 minutes which is doubled that of railway services. Many bus passengers have switched to using railway services.
- Due to changes in the travelling pattern of passengers, the patronage of Route No. 96 is consistently low, with the average occupancy being 14% (Causeway Bay bound) and 17% (Lei Tung bound) during non-peak hours and the minimum hourly occupancy being less than 2%.
- In view of the above, it is proposed to amalgamate Route No. 96 with Route No. 99. The routeing of Route No. 99 (Shau Kei Wan bound) will be altered to travel via Canal Road West, Gloucester Road and Causeway Road with the extension of service hours and frequency improvement to cater for passenger demand.



The Proposal

Currently, the patronage of CTB Route No. N72 remains low with an average occupancy of each departure at around 13%. Passengers of the route mainly travel between Southern District and Causeway Bay, while the average occupancy rate between the section of Causeway Bay and Quarry Bay is only about 7% (Wah Kwai bound) and 3% (Quarry Bay bound) respectively.

In view of the above, it is proposed to truncate the routeing of Route No. N72 to ply between Wah Kwai Estate and Tin Hau Station and convert the route to circular service. In addition, the routeing of Tin Hau bound journeys will be altered to travel via Ngan Mok Street, Lau Li Street and King's Road. An additional special departure will be operated from Tin Hau Station to Wah Kwai at 5.54 a.m.

To tie in with the proposed service adjustment of Route No. N72, new Octopus / electronic payment bus-bus interchange concessions between CTB Route Nos. 72, 592, N8X and N72 will be offered.



The Proposal

Currently, the patronage of CTB Route No. N90 remains low with an average occupancy of each departure at around 10%. Passengers of the route mainly travel between Southern District and Wan Chai / Admiralty, while the average occupancy between the section of Admiralty and Central (Macau Ferry) is only about 6% (Central bound) and 4% (South Horizons bound) respectively.

In view of the above, it is proposed to truncate the routeing of Route No. N90 to ply between South Horizons and Admiralty Station and convert the route to circular service. In addition, the routeing of Admiralty bound journeys will be altered to travel via Luard Road, Gloucester Road, Harcourt Road and Cotton Tree Drive slip road in lieu of Queensway. An additional special departure will be operated from Admiralty Station to South Horizons at 5.54 a.m.

To tie in with the proposed service adjustment of Route No. N90, new Octopus bus-bus interchange concessions between CTB Route Nos. N8X and N90 will be offered. In addition, for passengers of Route No. N8X (Kennedy Town bound), a new en-route stop at Hennessy Road outside CNT Tower and a new two-way section fare (\$9.7) from Central (Macau Ferry) to Admiralty will be provided.


