Bus Route Planning Programme for Southern District 2023-2024

Purpose

This paper elaborates and seeks the views of Members on the Bus Route Planning Programme (BRPP) for Southern District 2023-2024.

BRPP planning considerations

2. Franchised buses are major road-based mass carriers with high passenger carrying capacity and provide services with certain flexibility. Having regard to the local developments, demographic changes, completion of transport facilities, existing and planned public transport services in the districts concerned, etc., the Transport Department (TD) has been continuously enhancing the existing bus service network, and planning bus routes and adjusting bus services for developing and newly-developed districts as appropriate, so as to cater for the passenger demands.

BRPP for 2023-2024

- 3. In response to passenger demand and to tie in with local developments and infrastructure projects, etc., we have devised a draft BRPP for 2023-2024 following discussion with the local communities and franchised bus companies. The table attached provides proposals under the BRPP for Southern District and <u>Annexes 1 to 12</u> set out the details.
- 4. In formulating the BRPP, the TD and franchised bus companies make reference to the following guidelines on bus service adjustment:

Serving needs

- 5. To tie in with demographic changes, we will increase bus frequency in accordance with the existing passenger demand for bus service or introduce new bus services as appropriate.
- (1) Frequency Improvement
- 6. If the occupancy rate of any bus route reaches 90% and 75% during any busiest half-hour of the peak period and during that one hour respectively, or reaches 60% during the busiest one hour of the off-peak period, the TD and franchised bus companies will consider increasing its service frequency. Along with making reference to occupancy rate indicators, we will give consideration to providing a pleasant travelling environment for passengers, especially for bus services operated on longer routes.

(2) Introduction of Services

7. We will consider the introduction of new bus services having regard to community developments and population growth of individual districts. In considering the introduction of new bus services, the busy road sections of busy spots in the urban areas will be avoided and the number of bus trips operated by other bus routes on these road section will be reduced as far as possible. As the road-based mass carriers, buses can be more effective in using these road sections than other road vehicles such as private cars. Overall, more passengers using bus services will help improve traffic congestion on busy road sections.

(3) Interchange Schemes

8. We have been working with franchised bus companies to formulate bus-bus interchange schemes at appropriate and feasible locations to enable bus passengers to reach more destinations through interchanging with fare concessions. Such interchange schemes reduce the need for new long haul and direct point-to-point bus service, enable better utilisation of limited road space and bus resources, enhance the efficiency of the overall bus network, and lessen the traffic congestion and environmental problems caused by duplication of bus services.

Service Rationalisation

9. For bus routes with low utilisation, we will review those routes with franchised bus companies from time to time, so as to implement different measures to enhance their efficiency subject to their actual performance, including adjustment to the headway and service hour of existing routes, or truncation, amalgamation and cancellation of routes, etc, as appropriate.

(1) Frequency Reduction

10. If the average occupancy rate of an individual route is below 75% during the busiest half-hour of the peak period, or below 30% during the off-peak period, the TD and franchised bus companies will give consideration to reducing service frequency. However, in some cases when such a route serves actual travel needs of the district with no alternatives available (including bus-bus interchange service), or the peak headway of the route has been set at 15 minutes or more and off-peak headway at 30 minutes or more, then the TD and franchised bus companies will make consideration on individual merits, in order to achieve a better utilisation of bus resources and enhancement of the overall efficiency of bus network.

(2) Route Cancellation / Amalgamation

11. To ensure proper use of resources, if the utilisation of a low-frequency route is not high (i.e. a bus route with the highest occupancy rate lower than 50%, despite its headways having already been reduced to 15 minutes and 30 minutes or above during peak hours and off-peak hours respectively), we will consider proposing to cancel the route or amalgamate it with other route(s), after evaluating the impact on passengers and taking into account the alternatives available, including the service levels and fares of the alternatives.

(3) Route Truncation

- 12. To optimise the use of resources, the TD will examine the patronage of individual routes with the franchised bus companies from time to time, for example to see whether the majority of passengers have alighted en-route, thereby exploring the feasibility of truncating routes. As a reference benchmark, we will examine whether the route concerned has an occupancy rate of not more than 20% to 30% at the proposed terminating points during the busiest hour, for determining whether it should be truncated. Moreover, we will examine to see if there are any road spaces en-route to provide interchange facilities for passengers to interchange for other bus routes to their destinations and the availability of terminating facilities after the truncation.
- 13. Apart from making reference to the guidelines and factors set out in paragraphs 5 to 12 above, we will also review bus services holistically having regard to the overall public transport service network where appropriate, so as to maximise complementarity amongst the routes in the district. For individual proposals which can facilitate rationalising circuitous routes and optimising the use of resources, etc., for example, reducing the number of unnecessary bus routes or bus trips while redeploying spare resources to routes with genuine needs for service enhancement, we will explore room for bus service rationalisation and, through rationalising bus routes in the district, achieve more effective use of bus resources, enhance bus service network efficiency and improve service quality, so that the public can enjoy efficient service while bus services can achieve sustainable development.

Advice Sought

14. Members are invited to give views on the BRPP for Southern District 2023-2024.

Proposed Adjustment of Service Hours of CTB Route No. 6 and NWFB Route No. 66

Existing Operation Details

Please see <u>Appendix 1</u> for the existing operation details of CTB Route No. 6 (Stanley Village – Central (Exchange Square)) and NWFB Route No. 66 (Stanley Plaza (Ma Hang Estate) – Central (Exchange Square)).

The Proposal

- At present, the routeings and catchment areas of Route No. 6 and Route No. 66 largely overlap, with Route No. 66 providing services between Chung Hom Kok/Ma Hang and Central via Wong Nai Chung Gap Road only in morning and evening peak hours from Mondays to Fridays, and Route No. 6 operating in the remaining hours in addition to the busbus interchange between by CTB Route Nos. 6 and 6X (Central (Exchange Square) Stanley Village).
- To enhance bus services in Chung Hom Kok, Repulse Bay and Wong Nai Chung Gap, it is proposed that Route No. 66 be enhanced to provide daily service and extend its service hours. To tie in with the service enhancement of Route No. 66, it is proposed that the service frequency of Route No. 6 be adjusted and it will operate via Chung Hom Kok and Ma Hang after the last departure of Route No. 66 during night time.

Please see Appendix 2 for details of the proposed services.

Advantages

- After enhancement, Route No. 66 will provide more direct bus services for passengers travelling between Chung Hom Kok/Ma Hang and Wan Chai/Central.
- Passengers can take advantage of the combined departures (every 5-20 minutes) with Route Nos. 6 and 66 plying between Repulse Bay/Wong Nai Chung Gap and Central.

The Proposal

The present routeing of Route No. 973 from Tsim Sha Tsui to Stanley is quite circuitous, and travels via relatively congested road sections (such as Canton Road). It is proposed that the Stanley-bound journeys of Route No. 973 be diverted via Tsim Sha Tsui Star Ferry Bus Terminus, in lieu of the section of Chatham Road South between the Hong Kong Museum of History and Mody Road, and the section of Canton Road between Kowloon Park Drive and Salisbury Road, with a view to streamlining the routeing in the Tsim Sha Tsui area and thus promoting the service regularity of the route.

To tie in with the above re-routeing, the bus company will provide a new bus-bus interchange concession between Route No. 973 and NWFB Route No. 796X for passengers using Octopus/e-payment.

Advantage

• Upon the re-routeing, Route No. 973 could travel a streamlined routeing in Tsim Sha Tsui when heading for Hong Kong Island, making the route more direct and promoting the service regularity of bus services.



The Proposal

It is proposed to re-organise the services of NWFB Route Nos. 4 and 4X and CTB Route Nos. 48 and 71/71P to provide passengers in the Southern District with more frequent bus services covering various major locations in the district, the details are as follows:

Route No. 4

- To extend its service to operate between Shum Wan and Central Ferry Piers via Wong Chuk Hang Station and Wah King Street for journeys both bound;
- To extend service hours daily;
- To cancel the circular special departures from Wah Fu (South) in the morning;
- To enhance service headway to 8-12 minutes in the morning peak;
- To extend the service to Ocean Park at selected time periods on Saturdays, Sundays and public holidays;
- To introduce a section fare for section from Sham Wan to Wah Fu, tallying with the current fare of Route No. 48; and
- To relocate the terminating point to Central Ferry Piers for special departures from Tin Wan.

Route No. 4X

• Route No. 4X provides passengers in the Southern District with express service to Central. Given that the occupancy of its Central bound journeys after morning peak hours is low, and its routeing to the Southern District largely overlaps with that of Route No. 4, it is proposed that its last departure time be advanced to 1 p.m.

Route Nos. 48 and 71/71P

• As Route No. 48 has its routeing overlapping with that of Route No. 4 along the section from Wong Chuk Hang to Wah Fu and its catchment area partially overlapping with that of Route No. 71/71P from Wong Chuk Hang to Central, it is proposed that these three routes be cancelled and amalgamated with Route No. 4.



Proposed Extension of CTB Route No. 5X to Shek Pai Wan and Adjustment of Service hours of CTB Route No. 7

Existing Operation Details

For existing operation details of CTB Route No. 5X (Kennedy Town – Causeway Bay (Whitfield Road)) and CTB Route No. 7 (Shek Pai Wan – Central Piers), please refer to Appendix 1 °

The Proposal

- Before the westward extension of MTR Island Line to Kennedy Town, CTB Route No. 5X mainly provided express bus service between the Kennedy Town area to Central/Admiralty/Wanchai and the Causeway Bay business area. Upon the commissioning of West Island Line in December 2014, passengers can directly take MTR at Kennedy Town Station to Causeway Bay. As a result of the change in passengers' travelling pattern, patronage of Route No. 5X dropped drastically. The average daily patronage dropped by about 75% from 12,600 in November 2014 to 3,200 in November 2022. At present, the maximum peak hour occupancy rate is about 44% while the average non-peak occupancy and the lowest hourly occupancy are about 15% and 4% respectively. As such, there is a need to rationalise the service of Route No. 5X to cater to passengers' travelling pattern.
- There being no existing bus route operating from Southern District to Causeway Bay via Kennedy Town, it is proposed that the routeing of Route No. 5X be extended to Shek Pai Wan, and renamed as Route No. 7X in order to achieve efficient use of bus resources and limited road spaces. Routeing of Route No. 7X will be the same as that of the existing Route No. 7 for the section from Southern District to Pok Fu Lam, and then diverted via Smithfield, Kennedy Town and Route 4 to go to Central direct, before being diverted via Gloucester Road to head for Causeway Bay. For Shek Pai Wan bound journeys, Route No. 7X will be diverted via Luard Road, Gloucester Road, Kennedy Town and Smithfield after travelling Hennessey Road.
- Upon the above rationalisation, routeing of Route No. 7X will partially overlap with the catchment area of Route No. 7. Passengers can also choose to take alternative bus routes or enjoy the bus-bus interchange schemes to travel between Shek Pai Wan and Central. It is proposed that the service hours of Route No. 7 be changed to peak hours on Mondays to Fridays (except public holidays).
- Tying in with the above service rationalisation, the bus company will offer new concessions

for Octopus/e-payment users for interchange between CTB Route No. 7X and CTB Route Nos. 1, 5B and 10 to benefit passengers travelling between Western District and Central / Causeway Bay throughout the day.

• In addition, to provide convenience for passengers travelling between Southern District and the area from Pok Fu Lam to Sai Ying Pun in early morning and late night, it is proposed in this year's Bus Route Planning Programme that the service hours of NWFB Route No. 4 be extended to run from 5.15 a.m. each morning to 1.00 a.m. the next morning.

Details of the proposed services are at Appendix 2.

Advantages

- Upon rationalisation, Route No. 7X will, apart from providing straightforward bus service for passengers travelling between Aberdeen and Kennedy Town and between Pok Fu Lam and Causeway Bay, have its Causeway Bay-bound routeing diverted via more direct road sections, making the journey quicker and more convenient than the existing Route No. 5X.
- Route No. 7X, with service hours longer than that of Route No. 5X, will make it more convenient for passengers travelling between Kennedy Town and the area from Central to Causeway Bay.



The Proposal

• Currently, CTB Route Nos. 40 and 40M both provide services between Wah Fu North and Exhibition Centre Station. Their catchment areas largely overlap, particularly so for their Wah Fu-bound routeings, both of which running via Caine Road. As a result, patronage of both routes are low. Average occupancy of Route No. 40 (Wah Fu-bound) in the peakiest one hour stands around 45% only and the lowest hourly occupancy even at 10%. Meanwhile, average occupancy

- of Route No. 40M (Wah Fu-bound) in the peakiest one hour stands around 37% only and the lowest hourly occupancy even at 10%.
- In view of the above, it is proposed to operate Route No. 40M in single direction only, providing service from Wah Fu (North) to Exhibition Centre Station. In parallel, frequency of the Wah Fu-bound trips of Route No. 40 should be enhanced to cater for passenger demand.

The Proposal

• The catchment areas of NWFB Route No. 27 and CTB Route No. 85 overlap along the road section between North Point and Braemar Hill, and the occupancy of both routes along that road section after 9 a.m. has been low, averaging at 24% and 33% respectively. It is thus proposed to re-organise the services of Route No. 27 and Route No. 85. With service re-organisation of Route No. 85, the routeing and operation of CTB Route No. 41A will be adjusted accordingly. Details of the adjustment are as follows:

The Proposal

Current patronage of CTB Route No. 43M remains low for most time of the day, with occupancy rates during the peakiest one hour around 40% (Shek Tong Tsui-bound) and 34% (Tin Wan Estate-bound) only, and the lowest hourly occupancy even dropping to below 10%. Furthermore, mainly serving Western District and the area around Victoria Road, Route No. 43M has a service catchment overlapping with that of NWFB Route No. 971. As such, it is proposed that the service of Route Nos. 43M and 971 be rationalised as follows:

- Upon service rationalisation, passengers currently patronising Route No. 43M may switch to Route No. 971, which has a higher trip frequency. Meanwhile, section fare for passengers taking Route No. 971 to travel between Shek Pai Wan and Water Street / Hill Road will be adjusted downwards.
- Passengers from Wah Kwai and Wah Fu may take the re-routed Route No. 971 to Western Harbour Crossing interchange bus stop and to West Kowloon.

Arrangement after the Service Adjustment

Route No. 43M

Passengers currently taking Route No. 43M along Victoria Road after Mount Davis Path to the rest of Victoria Road and Hill Road may instead take CTB Route No. 1. Passengers from other road sections may take the re-routed NWFB Route No. 971 to their destinations direct, paying the same fare as that of the existing Route No. 43M*.



The Proposal

• At present, NWFB Route Nos. 63 and 65 provide services between North Point Ferry Pier and Stanley Village, with Route No. 63 operating via Repulse Bay Road on Mondays to Saturdays (except public holidays) and Route No. 65 operating via Aberdeen Tunnel on Sundays and public holidays.

- To provide more direct bus services between Stanley and Causeway Bay business area on Saturdays, it is proposed that the service hours of Route No. 65 be extended from Sundays and public holidays to Saturdays, Sundays and public holidays. As for routeings, the routeings of Route Nos. 63 and 65 are largely similar except for the section between Repulse Bay and Causeway Bay. With the adjustment of service hours of Route No. 65, the service hours of Route No. 63 will be adjusted accordingly and it will provide services only on Mondays to Fridays (except public holidays).
- To tie in with the service hours adjustment of Route No. 63, the bus company will offer the following new bus-bus interchange concessions for passengers using Octopus/e-payment travelling between Stanley, Repulse Bay and Tai Hang:
 - ➤ CTB Route Nos. 6/8X/25A, NWFB Route Nos. 25/66 and CTB Route No. 41A; and
 - ➤ CTB Route No. 6, NWFB Route No. 66 and CTB Route No. 10.

The Proposal

- Route No. 75 provides whole-day services connecting Shum Wan and the northern shore of Hong Kong Island. With the commissioning of the South Island Line in December 2016, passengers can travel to Admiralty and Central by railway from Wong Chuk Hang Station, leading to a change in travelling pattern. The daily patronage of Route No. 75 significantly dropped about 70% from 6,800 in November 2015 to 2,200 in November 2022.
- The occupancy rate of Route No. 75 has been low, with average off-peak occupancy around 15% (Central-bound) and 14% (Shum Wan-bound) only, and the lowest hourly occupancy even at less than 3%.

- Considering the changes in travelling pattern and better utilisation of resources, it is proposed to cancel Route No. 75. Simultaneously, CTB Route No. 72A (Shum Wan Causeway Bay (Moreton Terrace)) will advance its first departure to 5.10 a.m. (from Shum Wan) and 5.50 a.m. (from Causeway Bay (Moreton Terrace)) and deploy two additional vehicles to enhance its morning peak frequency to 15-30 minutes.
- To tie in with the above service adjustment, the bus company will offer new bus-bus interchange concessions between CTB Route No. 72A and CTB Route No. N90 for passengers using Octopus/e-payment to commute from Sham Wan to Wanchai/Central in the early morning.

Arrangement after the Service Adjustment

NWFB Route No. 95 mainly provides services between Lee Nam Road Industrial Area and Shek Pai Wan. Its routeing overlaps with those of CTB Route No. 95C and NWFB Route No. 595 in Ap Lei Chau and Aberdeen, all having a low average occupancy. It is proposed to rationalise the three routes as follows:

Route No. 95

• The service be cancelled.

Route No. 595

• The service be extended to operate via Shek Pai Wan (i.e. Aberdeen Reservoir Road and Yue Kwong Road).

Route No. 95C

- The service be extended to Lee Nam Road Industrial Area for both bounds from Mondays to Saturdays;
- Service hours be extended; and
- Morning special departures be introduced from Ap Lei Chau Estate to Aberdeen on Mondays to Saturdays (except Public Holidays).

To tie in with the above service adjustment, the bus company will offer new bus-bus interchange concessions between Route No. 95C and Route No. 595.

For details of the proposed services, please see Appendix 2.

Advantages

- After service rationalisation, passengers from Chi Fu, Tin Wan and South Horizons can travel to Lee Nam Road Industrial Area directly by taking the extended Route No. 95C.
- The extended Route No. 595 will provide more frequent services for residents in Shek Pai Wan travelling to and from Aberdeen or Ap Lei Chau, while passengers from South Horizons can take the bus for direct access to Shek Pai Wan throughout the day.



Existing Operation Details

Please see <u>Appendix 1</u> for the existing operation details of CTB Route No. 260 (Stanley Village – Central (Exchange Square)).

The Proposal

- To provide more convenient whole-day service for passengers travelling from Stanley, Repulse Bay and Deep Water Bay to Causeway Bay, it is proposed to re-route the Central-bound service of CTB Route No. 260 via Canal Road West and add an en-route stop to meet the needs of passengers travelling to Causeway Bay area.
- Moreover, the patronage of Route No. 260 on Mondays to Fridays has been low, with occupancy during the peakiest one hour around 48% and average off-peak occupancy around 17%. It is thus proposed to adjust the service frequency to 30 minutes intervals throughout the day on Mondays to Fridays (except public holidays), reduce the number of special departures from Stanley Prison from 5 to 4, and slightly adjust its service hours.

• This will provide an additional choice for passengers travelling from Stanley, Repulse Bay and Deep Water Bay to Causeway Bay.


